Ready to Cycle?

It is time to get the cows cycling. You have reached for the magic bottle. The animals that respond to this injection have been primed and ready to go. Why is it that the rest of the herd has not responded?

Most likely it is not the fault of the injection but rather the problem lies with the cow/heifer. Is she in a declining condition score? If she is losing weight she will not have enough body fat to cycle AND give milk, walk, keep warm and all her other metabolic needs.

Look at your cows and try to isolate the animals that are losing weight. These cows should be milked separately from the herd and fed more complex starch and grains to help them switch their body score from negative to positive. Giving these cattle more energy (carbohydrates) will help them milk and cycle.

All the drugs in the world cannot get a cow to cycle if her condition score is not good enough!
