Heart problems are relatively common in older pets. Many of these problems can be managed with medications.

As part of a regular check up your pet will have his/her heart examined. The most common problem we hear is leaking heart valves. In the early stages a small heart murmur may be heard.

As the condition progresses the murmur gets more obvious and sometimes a vibration can be felt over the ribs. Leaking heart valves can result in an accumulation of fluid on the chest. This often causes coughing.

Owners may also notice that their pet has exercise intolerance, is sleeping more or just seems to have slowed down lately.

Treatment usually involves medications to alleviate fluid on the chest and to help the heart pump more regularly.

Small dogs with heart problems usually have a good long term prognosis with medications.

Unfortunately treatment of larger dogs with heart problems is often not as successful.

If your older pet is coughing or has slowed down lately please visit for a check of his/her heart.

This is the new calf vaccine, given via the cow, that will really give you bang for your buck!

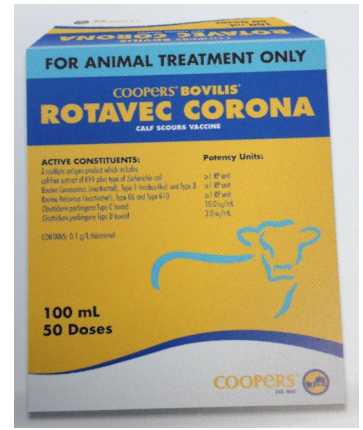
It is expected to be released within the next month. We will send out a big IT'S HERE via our website and Facebook page when we receive supply.

These are the biggest causes of death in calves. Acute diarrhoea at 3 to 10 days of age and then death.

You vaccinate the cow at dry off and then again at approximately one month later and you then have colostrum with the lot! You just have to get the colostrum into the new born calf...easy as pie!
