Skin Care at Home

Skin problems and allergies in pets often require ongoing management at home.



Regular bathing and ear cleaning and other strategies often prevent more serious problems that require veterinary visits and medication.

Medicated shampoos are an important management tool for skin problems. Malaseb is a shampoo that is both antibacterial and anti-fungal. It is used for smelly or infected skin. It needs to be scrubbed on well to contact the skin then left to work for 10 minutes before rinsing off. Malaseb can be used twice weekly if needed.

Aloveen shampoo is mild and soothing for inflamed skin. It also has a leave in conditioner that smells great!



Flea shampoos can irritate dogs with skin problems and be quite drying. Pets with skin problems do best with the spot on type flea control such as Frontline, Advantage or Revolution or the tablet, Comfortis. Most pets with sensitive skin are also allergic to fleas so effective flea control is an important part of home management.



Many pets with skin problems also have ear problems. Regular ear cleaning every 1-2 weeks is important to prevent re-occurrence of ear infections. The Paws Gentle Ear Cleaner is an over the counter product that helps to dissolve the waxy discharge that usually occurs with yeast infections in the ears.

Allergies are often the cause of skin problems. Anti-histamine tablets are very safe and can be bought over the counter at the chemist. They can be used as an important tool to settle itchiness in pets. Omega oils and pet food formulated for allergic pets can also be helpful for pets with skin problems.

Large Animal Drug Cabinets

What is in your drug cabinet? Well might you ask!

We have all got unused drugs sitting in our secured drug box with the labels covered in cow faeces or just plain faded away and you have no clue as to what it is or what it is for?

Here is a refresher

HISTAMIL: this is a potent anti-histamine. It is used for fire fever. It is given IM and repeated 12 hours later.

MULTIVITAMIN B: Is given with anti-histamine to aid liver function. It is also a potent appetite stimulant.

PENICILLIN: Best to treat a foot abscess and ill thrift in cattle.

TRIBACTRAL: This drug is very good for animals with diarrhoea. It can be used in conjunction with intra-mammaries when a cow has mastitis. The should be discussed with your Vet before injecting mastitis cows.

OXYTET: This is very useful for cows with pneumonia. It also can be used with intra-mammaries.

SYNTOCIN: Used for cows that do not let their milk down. It should also be used for ALL cows with mastitis to aid in removing milk from the infected quarter.
